Part 2: Description

On successful completion of this module, the student will be able to communicate effectively with sensitivity and compassion, and gain the ability to manage relationships with people to support the provision of high quality person-centred care. Nursing associates will develop a diverse range of communication skills and strategies to ensure that individuals, their families and carers are supported to be involved in their own care wherever appropriate (NMC 2018).

This module will enable the student to have a better understanding of cultural awareness when caring for people to ensure that the needs, priorities, expertise and preferences of people are valued and taken into account. The nursing associate will understand reasonable adjustments for people who have special communication needs or disability. They will provide and share information promote good health and health outcomes to ensure equal access of care for all.

The indicative content of the module will focus on the Nursing and Midwifery Council (NMC) standards (2018). Within each module in the programme, teaching and learning progressively explores the nature of care and practice, focusing on the NMC Standards of proficiency for nursing associate's platforms and annexes.

The module will use a variety of teaching and learning methods:

Lectures, seminars, case scenarios, reflective approaches, presentations, directed and independent learning, elearning, simulation

Part 3: Assessment

Communication skills across a range of settings and for people across the lifespan with a diverse range of needs is an essential part of healthcare delivery. This includes written, verbal and nonverbal, and digital communication.

Formative assessment:

Opportunities for formative assessment will occur throughout the module, the nature of the formative assessment will be designed to facilitate students to reflect on their level of knowledge and understanding of the module content. It will also encourage students to reflect on their individual communication skills, for example review and reflection of their participation/contribution in class.

Summative assessment:

A 15 minute presentation focusing on aspects of communication and relationship management required for clinical practice. Presenting will enable students to constructively share their knowledge of the importance of effective communication and also help them to develop their own communication competency.
