### Part 2: Description

On this modules students will explore the role of education in society and how educational institutions shape social practices. The module will be guided by the following questions:

- What does society want from education?
- What can education give society?
- How can education engender a more inclusive society?

To answer these questions students will examine current and emergent issues in educational practice whilst developing an informed perspective of the issues at hand with the support of relevant educational works. Students with participate in discussions and develop practical knowledge on a wide range of topics, as for example:

- Education and society
  - o A historical overview
  - o Pedagogical traditions (conservative, progressive and critical/emancipatory)
  - Educational curricula
  - o Educational achievement and attainment
- Education and Inclusivity
  - Human rights
  - Structures of in/exclusion (ethnic, gendered and classed identities/roles)
  - Disability and special educational needs

- Educational transformations
  - o Young people and their voices
  - Social justice
  - o The knowledge society

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In part this module will include a range of interactive, student centred sessions in which students develop skills and understandings of the role of education in society. Connection with all other modules in the year will also be evident.

#### Part 3: Assessment

Students will engage in different learning activities crucial to succeed in the module. Component B will focus on reflections emerging from debating opportunities which use students' readings as a stimulus. Component A will focus on inclusivity.
