### Part 2: Description

On completion of the module, the student will be able to contribute to the provision of care for people across the lifespan and the four fields of nursing, including those with complex needs. They will be able to understand the roles of a range of professionals and carers from other organisations and settings who may be participating in the care of a person and their family, and their responsibilities in relation to communication and collaboration.

The indicative content of the module will focus on the Nursing and Midwifery Council (NMC) standards (2018). Within each module in the programme, teaching and learning progressively explores the nature of care and practice, focusing on the NMC Standards of proficiency for nursing associate's platforms and annexes.

### Part 3: Assessment

Nursing associates are a key team member that contribute to the care of people, including those with complex needs. Reviewing the case study in relation to the learning outcomes considers their role within care provision.

**Formative assessment:** Group presentation with peer assessment using a structured proforma to ensure feedback is measured and consistent

#### Summative assessment

Presentation of a case study of a maximum of 20 minutes in length to demonstrate integration of care, followed by 5 minutes of questions.
