Part 2: Description

Educational Aims: Drugs, Crime and Society will introduce students to key themes and debates in the criminology of illegal drugs. The module will engage with a wide range of topics from changing patterns of use and dependency and drug related problems to national and international drug markets. The module draws on a range of theoretical and conceptual ideas to understand the nature of drugs, their use and regulation.

Outline Syllabus: Topics will include;

The role of the social environment in producing drug experiences.

Criminological theories of drug use, misuse and dependency.

Role of gender, age, class and ethnicity in drug use, culture and problems.

Relationship between drugs, drug cultures and criminal activity.

Local, national and international drug markets

Policing drug markets.

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Teaching and Learning Methods: Lectures and seminars will place these topics in their proper historical, political, scientific and cultural contexts. In the seminars, student will be expected to have covered assigned material, and to participate in group activities to explore key concepts and issues.

Part 3: Assessment

The assessment strategy for this module aims to measure both depth and breadth of knowledge and understanding achieved by students through one exam comprising of a short answer unseen section and a long answer seen section. This exam will allow students to demonstrate their knowledge, understanding and ability to recall facts, ideas and arguments in a range of situations. The exam-based assessment was selected in order to contribute to the development of key L2 skills the diversity of assessment methods on the programme as a whole. The module adheres to UWE Academic Regulations and Assessment and Feedback Policy, and assessment and feedback will form a critical aspect of the students learning process in line with UWE's Assessment and Feedback Policy and will follow UWE's inclusivity guidance.
