Educational aims: Drugs, Crime and Society will introduce students to key themes and debates in the criminology of illegal drugs. The module will engage with a wide range of topics from changing patterns of use and dependency and drug related problems to national and international drug markets. The module draws on a range

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of theoretical and conceptual ideas to understand the nature of drugs, their use and regulation.

Outline syllabus: Topics will include;

The role of the social environment in producing drug experiences.

Criminological theories of drug use, misuse and dependency.

Role of gender, age, class and ethnicity in drug use, culture and problems.

Relationship between drugs, drug cultures and criminal activity.

Local, national and international drug markets

Policing drug markets.

Part 3: Teaching and learning methods

Teaching and learning methods: Lectures and seminars will place these topics in their proper historical, political, scientific and cultural contexts. In the seminars, student will be expected to have covered assigned material, and to participate in group activities to explore key concepts and issues.
