Part 2: Description

Overview: Collaborate is an interdisciplinary optional module – programmes can choose to run it as a regular optional module to contribute to 120 credits at Level 4 or as an enhanced activity i.e. in addition to 120 credits at Level 4.

Students can only take one credit-bearing module run (with the ability to resit).

Features: The module includes a launch, time to research, reflect and develop work, an intensive “making” block, and culminating in a public exhibit in a professionalised

gallery setting. The format is designed to reflect contemporary working practices (such as sprints, sandpits, curation, exhibition, community workshops).

The module explores the development of enterprising behaviours, attributes, and competencies. In accordance with Enterprise and Entrepreneurship QAA Guidelines:

Behaviours can include: taking the initiative, making things happen, reflecting, communicating, pivoting and adapting, storytelling, taking responsibility, networking, personal effectiveness and managed risk taking.

Attributes can include: open mindedness, proactivity, curiosity, self-efficacy, flexibility, adaptability, determination and resilience.

Competencies can include: intuitive decision making, identifying opportunities, creative problem solving, innovating, strategic thinking, design thinking, negotiation, communicating, influencing, leadership and financial, business and digital literacy.

Educational aims: 1. Encourage collaborative, cross-disciplinary working, enabling students to develop professional skills in negotiation, team-working and entrepreneurialism.

2. Simulate real-world creative working practices and allow students the opportunity to develop real-world, professional outcomes.

3. Develop student's skills in research, communication, negotiation, presentation, and reflection.

Outline syllabus: UWE staff will deliver a brief, typically with a collaborative external partner. This brief is broad in scope and open to interpretation in such a way that students can approach the design and delivery of an outcome in ways that reflect their core discipline, all the while exposing them to a range of other linked subjects and disciplines.

Part 4: Assessment

Assessment strategy: 1. A group portfolio documenting the team's process, ideation, research, testing and learning journey.

2. An individual reflection that is an honest expression of the students learning journey and personal development during the module and how it will impact their

future practice.

These submissions may take the form of a blog, webpage, PDF, film, podcast, or other equivalent.

The learning outcomes of the module can be met both through the production of the work, and evaluation of the process. We have selected this assessment method as it allows students to create a group outcome, partake in a group presentation wherein they can talk about the process and group dynamics, and finally, a report through which individuals can reflect on their achievements.

Plagiarism will be designed out through the inclusion of process documents - students will have to evidence their journey, and part in the project, therefore, the risk of plagiarism is minimal.
