## Part 2: Description

This optional module considers changes to the operation of the English criminal justice system from c. 1750. This period saw the development of the modern adversarial trial, changes in defendants' rights including legal aid, and the development of a separate system for youth justice. These changes will be considered critically, and in context, acknowledging the role of law in reflecting and shaping English society. Students will use these historical perspectives to reflect on contemporary concerns such as access to the law, the operation of criminal justice, and the treatment of particular groups of people by the justice system.

## Part 3: Assessment: Strategy and Details

The assessment for this module is designed to develop students' research and critical analytical skills, building on learning at level 1, and in preparation for level 3. In particular, their ability to select and interpret evidence, and to construct a critically situated argument synthesising primary and secondary material.

Using original court records and related archival material, as well as relevant academic literature, students will select a theme from the module to interrogate in-depth, presenting their findings in a 3000 word research essay.

Feedback on assessment will be sent to students electronically. All students will be invited to attend individual tutorials to discuss their feedback.
