## Part 2: Description

This module will develop your management skills within a production department that is involved in a live production. This is usually the Stage Management department where you will take on a role as an Assistant Stage Manager, a Deputy Stage Manager or a Stage Manager for the first time. You may also choose to work within another area such as technical or construction as a Construction Manager or Production Electrician if your career aspirations lean in that direction.

Practical sessions will develop your management skills as you help coordinate your team's activity and will include logistical planning and technical skills relevant to the implementation of key production processes. We will look at public performances to illustrate differing design principles and approaches, and how the technology and craft principles are used to support the text in that particular context.

You will be responsible for managing the completion of your part of a project and develop project and time management skills, examining how the overall production schedule during the development of a show is affected by the creation and completion of its designed and managed elements.

You will take this module during your second year.

## Part 3: Assessment

To pass this module you must successfully pass both of the component elements below.

You will be assessed on your engagement with the team in your department and your management skills to deliver to the deadlines given. You will provide a written evaluation of your learning to demonstrate your understanding of the department. This will usually be written and submitted within the last week before the end of the production but may take the form of a tutorial presentation.

This is a pass / fail module – meaning that students are not given a grade or percentage for their work but either pass or fail the module.
