Part 2: Description
<p>Overview: Collaborative Project Management is designed to work in conjunction with UFCFCR-30-3 Collaborative Software Development Project to provide an integrated (development plus management) software development project experience.</p> <p>Educational Aims: To effectively plan, manage and deliver a collaborative software project through the use of an Agile project management methodology and processes (such as SCRUM).</p> <p>Outline Syllabus: Market research and initial investigation analysis</p> <p>Methodical approach to project management</p> <p>Resource identification and requirement analysis</p> <p>Apply Agile project planning and management</p> <p>Team dynamics, effective working and managing challenges</p> <p>Follow an Agile software development process such as SCRUM to iteratively progress towards defined objectives and goals e.g. Prioritised Requirements List (MoSCoW), sprint cycles, Product Backlog, Burndown Charts and Scrum Boards etc.</p>

Apply risk analysis methodologies i.e. RAID.

Teaching and Learning Methods: Throughout the module, a combination of lectures, group work, and research based tasks will be used to cover the theoretical underpinning of the module, and the practical application of project management. Group work is key for this module, ensuring students understand how to work as a team, and manage a collaborative project effectively. Opportunities for guest lectures will be explored to enhance the module.

Part 3: Assessment

This module is assessed by a combination of techniques: a presentation, and project report with supporting documentation.

The presentation allows students to demonstrate their knowledge and understanding of project management, analysing their initial project research and planning.

The final report and supporting documentation are used to assess students at the end of the project, and critically analyse their project performance and final outcomes.

Tutor-lead formative feedback will be available throughout the module.
