Part 2: Description

Overview: This module focuses on developing trainees' evidence-based knowledge, understanding and skills in cross-curricula teaching and learning across the Early Years and National Curricula and non-statutory subjects.

Educational Aims: Develop trainees' critical, evidence-based understanding of the application of a range of theories and effective practices to cross-curricula working.

Support trainees to understand and apply key concepts, curriculum and pedagogical approaches in teaching effectively and creatively across the curriculum with the subject and pedagogical knowledge required to teach children in a meaningful way across the Early Years and primary curricula and non-statutory subjects, including how to plan for the needs of individuals.

Provide opportunities for trainees to develop knowledge and understanding of the policies and policy context relating to curricula and teaching in England.

Outline Syllabus: The curriculum/curricula appropriate to the phases studied Cross-curricula teaching and learning – theory and practice Identifying and connecting key aspects of learning across subjects, including non-statutory

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subjects

Extend cross-curricular learning to address individual needs

Teaching and Learning Methods: You will engage with this module through a range of tutor-directed teaching and learning approaches, peer engagement and significant independent study. We prioritise learner agency and the development of learning skills and dispositions including research-informed questioning and debate. There is an expectation that trainees will link their academic studies to their professional development and practice throughout.

Part 3: Assessment

The presentation is part of a planned variety of assessments across the programme; it is particularly important in a programme for trainee educators that they experience a range of approaches.

In the presentation trainees will be expected to demonstrate critical engagement with cross curricular teaching and learning. Where they refer to an Early Years learning area or National Curriculum foundation subject it must be a different area/subject/s to that/those used in the assessment in the Foundation Studies module.
