Part 2: Description

Overview: This module focuses on the provision of costumes for film and television shoots. You will learn through participating in and contributing to production(s) and by individual guidance from the Course tutors.

Educational aims: See Learning Outcomes.

Outline syllabus: You will learn about the different roles relating to costume within a short film. You will discuss with the Director their expectations with regard to the costumes and act upon daily call sheets. You will construct and create a costume continuity file, plotting the story days for each of the characters using the script as your primary source.

Part 3: Teaching and learning methods

Teaching and learning methods: You will be assigned to an in-house BOVTS film / TV set attending production meetings with the Director and the production team. You will also receive individual tuition and appropriate oral feedback from the Costume tutors. You will be working with costuming students and professional actors.

The majority of the scheduled learning for this module will be location based and studio work at the School's Christchurch Studios. Independent learning in this module will include research into the specific look of the costumes for the shoot, backed up by images, research materials and designs collated from background information.

Module Learning outcomes:

MO1 Perform a role within the Costume team on a film / TV shoot

MO2 Implement an already established costume continuity file on a film or TV shoot referencing a marked-up film or TV script.

MO3 Be part of a team responding to costume requirements such as the need for repeats in the case of stunts and the possibility of blood and other substances on costumes.

MO4 Communicate effectively with the on-set Costume Supervisor on matters related to the costumes for the film / TV production and assist in sourcing costumes requirements.

MO5 A theoretical understanding of a film / TV costume budget.

Emphasis in making judgements about the student's performance will be placed on the team working and professional disciplines demonstrated by you, as well as the standard of practical costume skills displayed during the production process.
