Part 2: Description

Overview: The module will be undertaken by students intending to pursue a career in law and in particular, to qualify as a Solicitor and be Admitted to the Roll to practice in England & Wales (regulated by the Solicitors Regulation Authority).

This module will prepare students for practice but particularly for the specific

requirements of the assessment of the Legal Skill of Advocacy in the Solicitors Qualifying Exam 2 (“SQE 2”)

Educational aims: On successful completion of this module students will be able to:

Undertake the skill of Advocacy at the level expected by the Solicitors Regulation Authority of a newly qualified solicitor in legal practice. The SRA assessment criteria are set out in the STC Handbook, including the relevant functioning legal knowledge which will be assessed as part of the advocacy skill.

Outline syllabus: SQE2 is a centrally set assessment (administered externally on behalf of the Solicitors Regulation Authority) which a student must pass as part of the qualification framework leading to admission to the Roll to practice as a solicitor.

SQE 2 will comprise of a series of skills assessments undertaken at an assessment centre within a short time scale.

The SQE2 assessments will assess a candidate's ability in 6 core skills at the level expected of a newly qualified solicitor in legal practice.

This module specifically prepares students for the assessment of the skill of Advocacy in SQE2, which they will undertake in 2 separate assessment scenarios in the subject fields of Dispute Resolution and Criminal Litigation.

Extracts of the SRA Assessment for the skills of Advocacy and the relevant underpinning legal knowledge requirements will be available in the STC Handbook.

Part 3: Teaching and learning methods

Teaching and learning methods: The module is taught through:

Self-directed learning

Online learning through Blackboard including recorded demonstrations

Tutor led small group sessions to develop skills

A range of formative assessment exercises to develop students' skills in Advocacy in a range of subject contexts

Part 4: Assessment

Assessment strategy: 2 x Advocacy closed book unseen scenario assessments, undertaken in an assessment centre environment (to replicate that of the SQE2 assessment process) one each in the subject fields of

1. Dispute Resolution
2. Criminal Litigation

Students must achieve 50% overall to pass the module (N.B. The external SQE pass mark is achieved by obtaining an overall pass mark for SQE 2, which will be subject to SRA standard setting and may fluctuate annually).

Where a student does not successfully pass the Module Assessment but subsequently successfully passes SQE 2, they will be deemed to have passed the Module and attained credit for the purposes of the Programme Award.
