Part A: Programme Overview, Aims and Learning Outcomes

Overview: This programme is a fall-back award designed to enable students to complete an honours degree, who are unable to complete their original programme of study; their original programme of study will be a health and/or social care pre registration programme approved by a professional statutory regulatory body (PSRB).

Learning is based on a student-centred approach, where the student is encouraged and enabled to take responsibility for their own learning.

Students can only transfer onto this programme with the agreement of their programme leader; normally their programme leader (or nominee) will continue to oversee their journey through this programme.

Students should apply to transfer into the programme via the University internal transfer process.

Appropriate modules must be identified through discussion between the programme leader and student prior to a transfer being approved.

Access to relevant settings may be required to facilitate completion of some modules.

Immediately prior to entry the student must be enrolled on a PSRB approved health or social care pre-registration programme and have achieved at least 240 credits at level 4 or above from that programme.
